Message from the Founder & President

Message from the Founder & President

Etinan Children's Scholarship Foundation, Inc (Federal ID: 042023901)

Formerly known as Dr. Ibokette's Scholarship Foundation and launched in August 2017, the central goal of Etinan Children's Scholarship Foundation, Inc. has been to provide various forms of assistance to a group of indigent and orphaned elementary school-age children in Etinan, Akwa Ibom State, Nigeria. Through this assistance, the Foundation has been working to alleviate the tremendous and ongoing challenges that these children (popularly known as "scholars") face in their daily struggles for survival.

The Foundation successfully met these goals in the 2017/2018 and 2018/2019 academic school years. By the spring of 2019, however, we became more aware and conscious of the multi-faceted nature of the scholars' challenges. This awareness and reality check necessitated the re-evaluation, prioritizing and broadening of the Foundation's initial mission. In July 2019, the Foundation began to focus more specifically on four key forms of assistance, namely: the scholars' medical (including dental) needs; nutrition; clothing; and school-based needs.

Thanks to the support, generosity and fundraising skills of the Newton North High School community, the Akwa Ibom Community Association of Massachusetts (AICAM), colleagues, medical professionals, friends, and my family members, the Foundation very successfully made the necessary adjustments and continued to achieve many of its short-term goals. Since the mid- 2019, for example, all scholars have been receiving high level professional and comprehensive medical and dental examinations and treatments (including surgeries and other medical procedures) and on-going access to preventive medical services. Secondly, we set up a regular feeding program through which the Scholars continue to have three nutritious meals a week. We have also been giving them various items of clothing (including school uniforms, footwear, and Christmas outfits), school supplies (including backpacks), dental supplies, etc.

For these scholars, the highlight of the Foundation's activities has certainly been the yearly three-week Summer Enrichment Program (SEP). This program includes academic sessions, recreational activities, and breakfasts and lunches. For these scholars, the most exciting component of the SEP remains the two 16-mile-field trips in a "luxury" bus to Kilimanjaro Restaurant (a popular children's fast-food restaurant) in Uyo, the Akwa Ibom State capital.

While the Covid-19 pandemic has negatively impacted many aspects of the Foundation's activities particularly fundraising, we have been able to continue to provide for the scholars' basic needs. This year, the Foundation hopes to raise \$10,000.00 to continue with its mission. It will also continue to solicit the donation of clothes and sneakers (new and/or lightly worn) for these 8 to 11-year-old boys and girls. We would greatly appreciate any financial assistance that will enable us to meet our goals.

Many communities are privileged to have benefactors who always step up to help the less privileged and needy. I have been very impressed and appreciative of the work that my cousin, Isongesit Ibokette, has been doing through his non-profit organization, Etinan Children’s Scholarship Foundation, Inc. (ECSF). It is in this spirit that I founded the Aniedi Itina Youth Empowerment Program (AIYEP). The sole aim of this philanthropic organization is to train less privileged youths in Etinan in a variety of professional fields. Since 2019, the organization has trained 10 youths and provided them with the necessary finances, tools and equipment in different fields: eight in tailoring, one in auto mechanics and one in plumbing technology.

Love Without Borders Foundation (LWBF) Inc., continues to stand with Etinan Children’s Scholarship Foundation, Inc (ECSF) - formerly known as Dr. Ibokette’s Scholarship Foundation - which gives young, less privileged children of Etinan, Akwa Ibom State, Nigeria, a brighter future. The ECSF’s commitment to impacting the lives of these young people by laying a solid and quality education foundation at the primary level is highly commendable.

The Covid-19 pandemic while creating a major hindrance in the ability of foundations like ours to raise funds and execute projects has allowed us the opportunity to seek other avenues to render assistance.

LWBF Inc. In 2019 gave out scholarships worth fifty thousand naira (50,000.00) each to 20 students in Polytechnics and Universities in Nigeria.

In December of 2020, Love Without Borders empowered 30 widows in Etinan, Akwa Ibom State, by giving out small business start-up capital of thirty thousand naira (XX30,000.00) each.

Just last December in partnership with Women Initiative for Empowerment of the Less Privileged (WIELD) funded another small capital start-off funding project for 20 widows in Etinan.
